Third Grade Discipline Policy

Each student will have a clip on the conduct chart. Students will move his/her clip to the next color for an infraction inside the classroom or outside the classroom.

Rules:

- I. Be respectful of ourselves and others.
- 2. Follow directions the first time given.
- 3. Keep hands, feet, and other objects to yourself.
- 4. Come to class prepared with materials every day.

Students begin every day on Blue "Ready to Learn;" this is where students are expected to stay for great behavior.

Conduct Color Key:

Purple-Great Job (Student exemplifies behavior above and beyond the expectation)

Blue-Ready to Learn (Classroom expectation)

Green-Think About It (Warning)

Yellow-Slow Down (-I point from conduct)

Orange-Teacher's Choice (-2 points from conduct, discipline form sent home)

Red-Parent Contact (-3 points from conduct, discipline form sent home)

Students are responsible for coloring their behavior chart each day. Parents should review it daily in the maroon MBS folder. Discipline forms for infractions must be signed and returned to school the following day.

Students will start the 9 weeks with 100%, and points will be deducted as necessary. If a student's conduct grade drops below an 84%, the student will be placed on an Accelerated Discipline Plan. This plan may include office visits or recess detentions, depending on the needs of the student. Below is the excerpt from the Handbook.

<u>Accelerated Discipline Plan</u> - When a student reaches an 84% in conduct during a nine-week period for grades 3-8, the student will be placed on an accelerated discipline plan by administration and a letter will be sent home to the parents.
